Project summary	<p>The ophthalmology service in Yeovil has grown significantly over the last 4 years and has now reached a point where demand is outstripping capacity, therefore investment is required to redesign the service to make improvements which aim to enable demand to be managed over the next 5 years.</p> <p>The project will involve:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Workforce redesign, where appropriate HCPs will be trained in the use of new imaging technology, and trained to give treatment to patients according to agreed pathways• Implementation of new technology which aims to allow improvements in the management of medical retina patients, as well as an increase in the number of patients that can be imaged and treated within the eye unit• Initiation of virtual clinics for medical retina patients, as well as for patients referred from the diabetic screening service and additional macular treatment clinics <p>These changes will be implemented and embedded by the redesign of patient pathways and ongoing training and development of staff.</p>
